

Suspension of Admission To Nagoya Castle Tower

Due to surveys and construction surrounding the restoration of the wooden structure of Nagoya Castle Tower, admission to the current Castle Tower will be suspended from Mon., May 7, 2018 until its completion.

We apologize for any inconvenience caused in regard to accessibility within the Nagoya Castle premises due to the opening of the Kinshachi Yokocho areas as well as the completion and opening of Hommaru Palace, and hope visitors will continue to enjoy their time spent at Nagoya Castle.

Information on Admission to the Nagoya Castle Premises After Suspension of Admission to the Castle Tower

Aside from the Castle Tower, Nagoya Castle's premises will be open as usual while admission to the Castle Tower is suspended. Only Castle Tower admission will be suspended. Until construction such as disassembly of the Castle Tower begins, its outside can still be seen. Disassembly construction of the current Castle Tower is planned to begin from September 2019, and the Castle Tower with its restored wooden structure is planned to be completed in December 2022.
